It is envisaged that one role will primarily be based in the North Midlands and the other along the M4 corridor, however, travel will be required in line with business requirements.</p> <p>You will be expected to have an understanding of the physiological changes to the athletes heart and differentiation from pathology.</p> <p>You will be responsible for performing a Resting ECG and a Transthoracic Echocardiogram to BSE guidance and additional measurements to support elite athlete sports cardiology assessments (additional training will be provided to support this if needed.) <p>Tasks</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To carry out diagnostic echocardiography and report clinical echo studies independently and promptly to British Society of Echocardiography guidelines.</li> <li>• To carry out when required 12 lead resting ECG, occasional Fitting of 24hr, 48hr, 7 day Holter ECG, and 24hr BP. The ability to analyse 24hr/48hr/7day ECG would be desirable.
